- Option 1. Summarize the reading assignment with no more than 6 sentences.**
- Option 2. Outline the reading assignment, using parallel construction.**
- Option 3. Write 5 questions over the reading assignment.**
- Option 4. Write a Statement of Theme for the reading assignment.**
- Option 5. Write a poem of 8 – 16 lines over the reading assignment.**
- Option 6. Dramatize one part of the reading assignment. You must use at least two characters, and each character must speak at least four times.**
- Option 7. Draw a cartoon, or a cartoon strip, illustrating the reading assignment.**
- Option 8. Design your own summary for the reading assignment.**
